

This is a consolidation of what has been done to calculate Fee Waiver Thresholds.

Fee Waiver Thresholds

- 1. The Full Fee Waiver threshold is established annually based on the appropriate Statistics Canada Low Income Cut-Offs Before Tax, adjusted by the average Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Alberta. For the current school year, we will consider the previous year's pre-tax income for the applicant (for example for 2025/2026 we would use 2024 information).
- 2. The appropriate Statistics Canada Low Income document being used is *Low income cut-offs* (1992 base) before tax and referencing the latest figures, for calendar 2025. The 'Community size' column 'Rural areas outside CMA or CA' is used for outside of Grande Prairie area; and the column 'between 30,000 and 99,999 inhabitants' is used in the Grande Prairie area.
- 3. These numbers are adjusted upward by the average of the annual CPI adjustment for Alberta as indicated in *Statistics Canada Consumer Price Index (CPI)*, by province (Alberta).
- 4. The 50% Fee Waiver threshold will be set at four-thirds of the 100% Fee Waiver Threshold.
