- 1) Use Media together – whenever you can, watch, play and listen with your kids. Talk about content.
- 2) Internet Safety and Online Privacy – Explain that nothing is really private online.
- 3) Social Networking and Virtual Worlds – Help kids understand the line between funny and cruel.
- 4) Role Models and Stereotypes – Grab the headlines, and make them teachable moments.
- 5) Educational Issues – Don’t assume that your children automatically know what’s right and wrong.
