- Buildings and facilities are maintained to a very high standard, providing safe and conducive learning environments for all
- Collaboration with the APLC (Alberta Professional Learning Consortium) and Alberta Assessment Consortium to provide professional development to our educators and administrators on diverse topics
- Collaborating, sharing resources and delivering division-wide professional development related to Indigenous education; Honouring Spirit: Indigenous Student Award
- Enhancing learning spaces with outdoor classrooms
